The Minden Project: Coming August 2017

Almost two years ago, at an event in Kearney, members of the Minden Board of Education walked through the doors one bright sunny morning, even more giddy than normal.

It was here, we learned that they had just finalized the planning process and funding of a much needed new building for grades 9 through 12.

Recently, NASB was lucky enough to don hard hats and get a tour of the progress of a project that first garnered discussion in 2005.

We'll let the photos tell the story, but the new High School, attached to the current Middle School will have access points in all entrances, a great open commons area, beautiful auditorium, shop room doors big enough to build and then take out a shed, much more space for music with vocal and band finally together, and incredible classroom space for a growing student population.

The building is set to open for the start of the 2017-18 school year on August 17th. As you'll see, inside the walls of the commons area, they have worked to honor the past by incorporating stone from the current building built in 1936.

Superintendent Melissa Wheelock, who led the tour, explained the importance of honoring the past with the stone, while moving forward as a community. "This type of project cannot be done without

The community understood that the age of the current facility, as well as a much needed update of the wiring, sewers, and growing technological needs meant that a new building was the logical route to take. The district already owned the land the new building sits on, as it was previously the middle school playground and practice fields. As Wheelock stated, "This building is as cost effective as we could make it, while still having a nice facility to best suit our students, and their needs."

We are excited to make a return trip this Fall once it is complete!



A packed house, full of students and education leaders alike made their way to Kearney for the SWEAT Conference. SWEAT is a student health and wellness conference with breakouts, general sessions, and brain break exercise sessions on physical, mental and behavioral health, and how it affects your school policies.

Wednesday evening kicked off with a Healthy Schools Showcase, featuring schools across Nebraska sharing the details of a specific program that has positively impacted their students' mind, body, or spirit. Schools included: Beals Elementary (OPS); Grand Island Public Schools; Kearney Public Schools; Lincoln Public Schools; Millard Public Schools; Norris Public Schools; North Platte Public Schools; and York Public Schools.

Next up was Dan Meers, who has spent over two-decades as KC Wolf. Meers shared his story, including a tragic accident during a stunt that nearly took his life or ability to ever walk again, and encouraged the audience to use every day you have to the fullest, and live a life of influence.

Thursday morning, Dr. Ali Khan, Professor and Dean, College of Public Health, UNMC, spoke to Call for Healthier Children in Nebraska. Following Dr. Khan were two breakout sessions with topics including:

- How to make schools and classrooms more resilient
- Farm to school
- PE Standards Update & Wellness Policy Implementation Strategies
- Innovative Nutrition Ed Programs

Following lunch, Dayle Hayes, <u>@SchoolMealsRock</u>, shared ways in which school meals improve learning environments.

Next up, BRAIN BREAKS! 5th graders from Kearney Public schools came over to lead work stations, exercises, and some easy energizing dance moves to keep the mind and body active! Great participation by all.

The day closed with two more rounds of breakouts, with topics covering:

- Addressing hunger and food insecurity in our communities
- The Whole Child and Property Taxes

Hundreds of Nebraska's school board members and administrators made their way to the Mile High City for three days of speakers, sessions and sharing ideas.



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


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School Law Seminar June 8-9 | Kearney
