I AM A NEW BOARD MEMBER, NOW WHAT?

Welcome, new board members! I am hopeful that you have had the opportunity to join the NASB New Board Member Webinars. NASB is committed to providing the in-person workshop in 2021, please stay tuned to this space for more information when available! In the interim, here are a few quick tips from the NASB Board Leadership team:

WHAT AUTHORITY DO I HAVE AS A BOARD MEMBER? You have been elected to serve on a board; therefore, you only have authority as a collective body. You do not have authority as an individual board member.

A PATRON STOPS ME AT THE COFFEE SHOP TO SHARE THEIR CONCERNS. WHAT SHOULD I DO? Although you want to be an empathetic listener, it is very important that you encourage the patron to follow the chain of command (per policy). Immediately contact your superintendent and turn the matter over to him/her to respond to the concerns of the patron.

HOW DO I PLACE AN ITEM ON THE AGENDA? Review board policy.

HOW CAN A BOARD MEMBER EFFECT CHANGE? The board governs through policy and acts or gives a directive to the superintendent/ESU Administrator when a majority of the board acts. The board advances education and the district/ESU when collaborating with administration to establish and adopt goals.

WHAT IS THE BOARD'S ROLE IN EVALUATING PERSONNEL? The board is responsible for evaluating the superintendent and/or ESU Administrator. Each year the board must evaluate the superintendent or ESU Administrator. The board delegates the responsibility to the superintendent or ESU Administrator and holds him or her accountable for evaluating other district or ESU employees.

QUICK TIPS FOR ALL BOARD MEMBERS:

1. Listen with the intent to understand.
2. Devote sufficient time and thought to the responsibilities associated with this role, attend, and participate in all scheduled board meetings.
3. Participate in board learning opportunities to expand your knowledge and understanding of the role and educational issues.
4. Communicate in a respectful and professional manner with administration and other board members.
5. Adhere to the adopted Board Code of Conduct.
6. Recognize the authority of the board rests only with the board and not with individual board members.
7. Honor the chain of command and refer complaints appropriately and report to the superintendent.
8. Maintain confidentiality of all discussions and matters addressed during closed session.
9. Support decisions in the best interest of students and the district/ESU.
10. Refrain from using the position of board member for personal gain or benefit over the interest of the school district.

Prior to the March enrollment period for natural gas, many districts will be receiving 3-year NJUMP or CJUMP election forms for choosing their gas provider. ... POLICY

With several months of school remaining, this is often a good time to look at certificated employee evaluation policies and discuss how evaluations are proceeding. Board members are not permitted to see individual evaluation results due to the board's dual role as Judge and Jury in the event of a termination hearing. However, it is worth having a discussion to determine the frequency of evaluations for tenured staff and to receive a general report on this year's progress in working through them, particularly with all the disruptions of recent months. If your district is considering changes to its evaluation policy or detailed evaluation instrument due to the many changes in instructional methods and practice, that revised document must be submitted to the Nebraska Department of Education for approval.

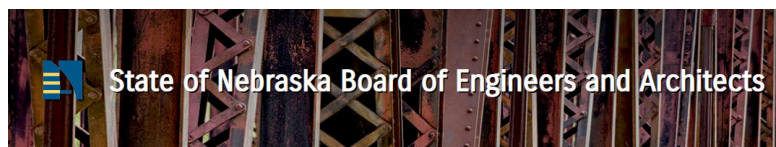

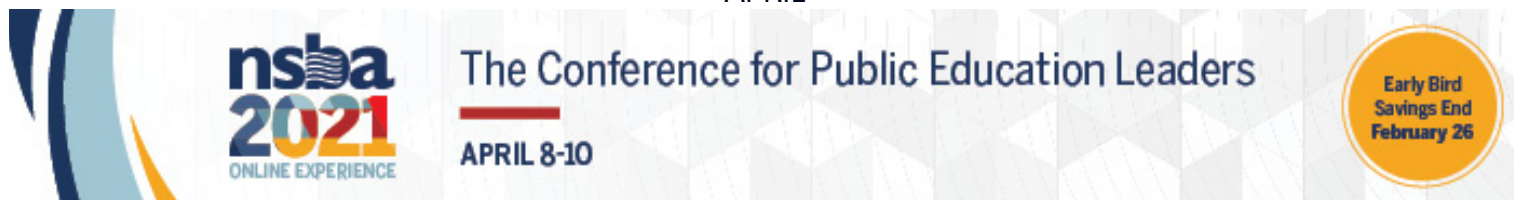
