P2T Career Programs taking shape in ESU #2

Located in Fremont, ESU #2 has a long history of supporting schools in Burt, Cuming, Dodge, and Saunders Counties.

Over the past few years, many of these area schools have expressed interest in developing Rule 47 compliant career academies to serve students seeking alternative post-secondary opportunities. With that, ESU #2 in partnership with rural school districts and Nebraska Department of Education staff completed the reVISION process over the course of the 2015/16 school year.

There are six schools that ultimately joined this career pathway consortium including Bancroft-Rosalie Community Schools; Lyons-Decatur Northeast; Oakland-Craig Public Schools; West Point-Beemer Public Schools; and Wisner-Pilger Public Schools from ESU #2, as well as one school from a neighboring ESU, Pender Public Schools located in Thurston County.

These districts are representative of many others across the state. This is why the development of this innovative approach to career and technical education is important to implement so that it may be replicated in other regions across Nebraska. This plan evolved into Pathways 2 Tomorrow (P2T).

Dr. Ted DeTurk, administrator of ESU #2, said the educational partners are undertaking a truly unique endeavor. “The vision of the Pathways 2 Tomorrow leadership group is to provide extraordinary learning opportunities to member districts. Our partnership with postsecondary institutions will serve as a replicable model that supports and nurtures K-12 students as they begin the transition between K-12 and their chosen career endeavors.”

School superintendents say the partnership is important to the region.

“This partnership will provide quality career-focused programs for our students that prepares them for continued education and employment and contribute to the economic development of our communities,” said Dr. Jon Cerny, superintendent of Bancroft-Rosalie Community Schools.

Lyons-Decatur Northeast Superintendent Fred Hansen said, “P2T provides a new and unique opportunity for area juniors and seniors to experience a career opportunity in the area of their choice while still in high school. These experiences are beyond the scope of what individual high schools can

offer. I am excited about what the future may bring through this cooperative effort among area high schools.”

Jason Dolliver, superintendent at Pender Public Schools, said he is excited his district is part of the P2T consortium of schools. “This is a great example of what can happen when schools collaborate, have a shared vision, and want what is truly best for students. Together, we are providing students with high quality educational experiences and opportunities we can’t offer independently. I am proud PPS is part of P2T and look forward to what lies ahead!”

After much planning and preparation, six schools (Bancroft-Rosalie, Lyons-Decatur Northeast, Oakland-Craig, Pender, West Point-Beemer, and Wisner-Pilger) have formed a JPA (P2T) to provide funding the long-term sustainability of these programs. The Joint Public Agency allows for the creation of a separate legal entity with funding provided by each party through the contribution of levy authority and a representative board resulting in a new political subdivision with similar rights and responsibilities.

We see this structure as a way to reimagine the senior year of school for many of the students in the consortium. Students will no longer fill their senior year with electives but will enroll in programs that they are interested in and possibly give them a head start on a career or at least provide a great start in their career choice. We feel that we can reach students earlier in their career choice and that academics plus career readiness equals a balanced education.

P2T Career Programs for the 2017/18 year include Computer Science, Health Science, and Construction pathways, all identified by community and business needs, as well as student interests. All programs provide students the opportunity to follow multiple pathways: school to work, school to community college, and school to four-year institutions. All Pathways have been identified and are aligned to ensure high transferability to all NE public postsecondary institutions. Over the next five years P2T will create a total of six career academies to meet the needs of students, adding Skilled & Technical Science (welding and residential construction), Education, Transportation, and Agriculture.

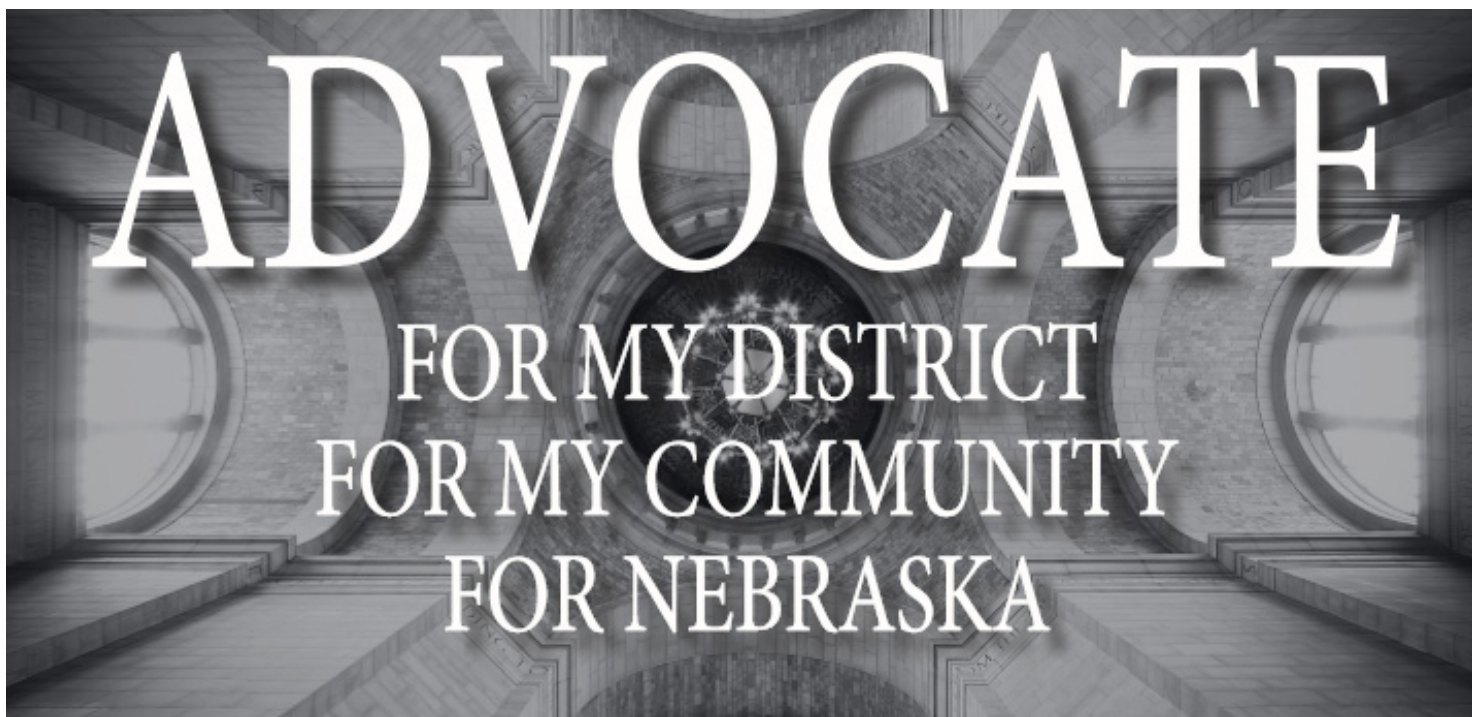

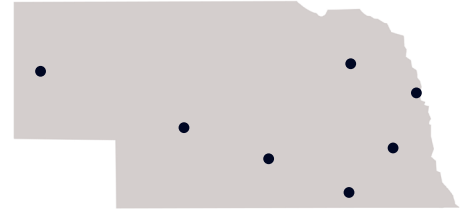

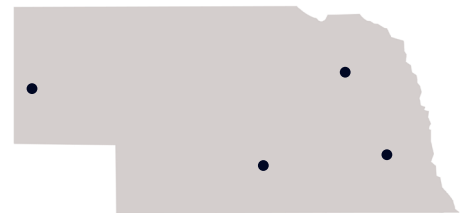
