"... THE MORE PLACES YOU'LL GO"

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Prior to her election to the State Board of Education in November 2020, Patti Gubbels served on the Norfolk Board of Education, and was a member of the NASB Board of Directors, and the NASB Legislation Committee since 2016.

"The more that you read, the more things you will know. The more you learn, the more places you'll go." Dr. Seuss

The State Board of Education has long realized the importance of learning to read. In 2002 the Board adopted a standing position related to Early Literacy that was revised in 2019.

More recently some state legislatures have passed early literacy or reading improvement bills. Mississippi, in 2013 passed the Literacy-based Promotion Act, a state led comprehensive approach to improve literacy outcomes that led to the state having the highest NAEP 4th grade reading scores in the nation in 2019.



The Nebraska Legislature, in 2018 passed the Nebraska Reading Improvement Act acknowledging how important learning to read is for academic and lifelong success. The overriding goal of the law, which was implemented in the 2019-2020 school year, was to make sure each student be able to read at or above grade level by third grade. The law required diagnostic assessments, development of individual reading plans for students deficient in reading, communication with parents, and evidence-based interventions.

To that end, the Nebraska Department of Education developed "Nebraska Reads" an NDE comprehensive early literacy website that not only supports the requirements of the Reading Improvement Act but also includes a wealth of reading/literacy resources such as read at home plans, a dyslexia guide, and professional development resources that build high-quality early literacy instruction skills based on the science of reading.

The science of reading is a body of multi-disciplinary research (research from cognitive and developmental psychology, education, and linguistics/ communication) that focuses on understanding the cognitive processes that are necessary for effective reading and examines how reading develops. The science of reading has led to the development of evidenced-based instructional practices that work for literacy instruction. The five "big ideas" of science of reading based instruction are: Phonological/Phonemic Awareness, Phonics, Fluency, Vocabulary, and Comprehension. Phonemic awareness is the ability to work with spoken sounds in words, phonics is the ability to make sound-letter associations and to decode words, fluency is the ability to read accurately, quickly and with expression. Vocabulary is understanding the meaning of words, and comprehension is understanding what you have read.

Nebraska has made strides in training teachers on evidence-based reading practices, but the Nebraska Department of Education does not have the resources necessary to implement a comprehensive state-wide approach to improving literacy like those found in other states such as Mississippi and Tennessee.

To advance early literacy the NDE included in the 2023-2025 biennial budget request 20 million dollars over the next two years. Year one requests were to provide specialized training in reading instruction (LETRS training), to collaborate with Educator Preparation programs to implement science of reading instruction in college coursework and clinical experiences, and to provide high-quality early literacy instructional materials. Year 2 funding would have supported a state-wide network of reading coaches and funding for home-school partnerships focused on literacy development. Family engagement is a critical piece in the field of early literacy. Parents and caregivers afford children a literacy development advantage by reading to them and naming and defining concepts that children experience. The more words children know the definitions of before they formally begin learning to read, the less likely they are to experience cognitive overload as they read. Additionally, if children don't understand the meaning of the words they read, they cannot comprehend what they are reading. Dr. Suess might have said "the more you know the more you can read."

One of the Nebraska State Board of Education legislative priorities is to Increase Language Arts Proficiency to 75% by 2030. Transforming early literacy instruction through the implementation of a state-wide comprehensive program is the approach to help reach that goal.

A step that the State Board has taken, with proposed Rule 20 Approval of Educator Preparation Programs is to set the expectation that educator candidates will possess literacy instruction skills based on "the science of reading".

The State Board of Education will continue advocating and working with senators to support requested funds, so the goal of the Reading Improvement Act that all Nebraska children are reading at or above grade-level by third grade can be attained.

One of the most impactful and cost-effective tools school board members have to raise K-12 achievement is quality early childhood education. Yet too many families in Nebraska do not have access to quality, affordable child care and early learning. NASB has joined **We Care for Kids** to change that.


We Care for Kids is a community-based, statewide effort to build support for quality early childhood education in Nebraska. With more than 65 community partners, the campaign connects families to resources, elevates the early childhood workforce by sharing their stories, and provides communication tools for networks and organizations to raise awareness, engage communities, and activate conversations.

As champions for education, you know first-hand the need for quality early childhood education and understand its impact on Nebraska's children, families, communities, school systems, and economy. Nebraska voters understand it too. A recent statewide public opinion survey of registered voters in Nebraska commissioned by Nebraska Extension and We Care for Kids found that nearly nine-in-ten support the state investing in ensuring more working families have access to quality, affordable child care and early learning. This support is across party lines.


The survey revealed that Nebraska is facing a child care and education crisis that is hurting families, employers, and Nebraska's reputation as a great place to live, work, and raise a family. The lack of quality, affordable child care and early learning is deemed to be a serious problem by nearly three-quarters of Nebraskans and is on par with housing and crime.

According to the Voices for Children Kids Count Report in Nebraska, 72% of Nebraska's children under age six live in homes where all adults work, yet 91% of counties in Nebraska with licensed child care programs do not have enough places to meet the demand—and 11 counties have no licensed child care.


Lack of quality, affordable child care and early learning is deemed to be a serious problem by nearly three-quarters of Nebraskans

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

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... ADVOCACY & GOVERNMENT RELATIONS

This year's Session is done, the work is not! 850+ bills & measures introduced NASB followed roughly 110 Supported 31, Opposed 31

32 bills we followed were approved by the Governor directly, or amended into another bill.

Many bills passed this year will require a POLICY CHANGE by the board. Policies on option enrollment, dress code, and graduation requirements for example will require board review and/or action.

SCHOOL FUNDING has gone through a change as well. Foundation Aid will now be part of the formula in addition to an increase to 80% SpEd reimbursement. On the flip side, there are new caps on property tax requests.

A number of Interim Hearings for later this year have been introduced on topics like Truancy, School Choice, Parental Involvement, SEL, Mandates, Security, Equalization, Consolidation of ESUs, Early Childhood, and more.

20+/- SBMs have testified in front of a legislative committee for themselves, their district or on behalf of NASB!

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... POLICY

Section 126 (yes, 126) of the recently passed and lengthy LB705 requires districts to annually provide access to any "Federally Recognized Youth Organizations." Although this is a lengthy list of organizations, many do not have a presence in most Nebraska communities. Districts are allowed to set reasonable constraints on how this will operate in their schools and it should generally not create problems at this time. NASB can provide a list of the organizations currently approved by Federal law.


