ENGAGING THE WORLD STARTS HERE IN NEBRASKA'S PUBLIC SCHOOLS

As education changes and evolves, NASB has looked outside of the traditional K-12 box, to expand our partnerships across various levels, from healthcare to business, agriculture to early childhood, and in this process, we have built up a very strong relationship with the University of Nebraska.

One item we'd like to highlight is the University's Global Engagement report that was just released. Particularly how some of the students featured within the report got their roots as products of public education in Nebraska.

Global engagement at the University is nothing new. With today's increasingly interconnected world it is key to prepare students for the global economy. As of the Fall of 2017, the University was home to nearly 4,500 International students. In return, it is equally important students from the U.S., specifically Nebraska, have the opportunity to expand their horizons and study abroad to gain a better understanding of global and regional issues. In the past few years, the Board of Regents has focused on increasing the number of students who participate in education abroad, with around 1,500 students studying abroad during the 2015-16 school year.

One of those students is Bianca Zuniga. Bianca is from Omaha and just graduated from UNO with a degree in Multidisciplinary Studies, with an emphasis in Speech-Language Pathology, Spanish, and American Sign Language. Prior to that, she was a student in Omaha Public Schools her whole life, attending Bancroft Elementary, Beveridge Magnet Middle, and Central High School.

Raised in America by immigrant parents from El Salvador, Bianca always felt a dissonance between her home and school culture. Enter the opportunity to study abroad in Costa Rica.

"I've always wanted to travel," she said. "Since a young age, I've always questioned everything and found that I discovered through experience. As I began to learn about different languages, countries, and cultures, my curiosity about the larger world only grew."

"I would have friends go to different countries and come back with amazing stories and a different perspective of the world. Hearing stories was not enough; I wanted to create my Vhen I realized I could get credit for my Spanish courses and go during the summer, I did not

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hesitate to make this a reality for myself."

There were some roadblocks though. "The hardest part of this whole experience was convincing my parents it was ok. They are very traditional and were completely against me studying abroad in the beginning. I have always been very determined, so I did A LOT of research on the country. I sat down and talked to them about the entire process."

Bianca now hopes to take her experience in Costa Rica and incorporate it into her daily life, as she looks to start her career working in early intervention and prevention within the Hispanic community.

"I came from a home that did not really know the importance of language development. When my brother was diagnosed with a developmental delay at age three and autism at age five, I discovered my family and I were not alone in this world of confusion. We began to teach our family and friends about the important role they play in a child's language acquisition; however I struggled with understanding certain beliefs and practices I saw in some parents. When I went to Costa Rica, I felt I could really connect with my culture and the misunderstandings and confusions I had about child-rearing practices had cleared up. I came back with a new perspective on how to talk to families within the Hispanic community here in Nebraska. I strongly believe my experience abroad taught me many life skills and showed me how to balance my American and Latin culture, and how I can use this in the future when working with families."

"One of the strengths of OPS is the diversity of the student population," said OPS Board Member Shavonna Holman. "That diversity continues to grow with an increasing migrant student population and English Language Learner population. Educators and students have an opportunity to experience one another's cultural uniqueness and learn more about one another's life experiences. These are the kinds of experiences that are helping prepare students to engage in a global environment."

Bianca closed with one emphatic statement. "Costa Rica helped me learn to accept myself—and to find myself." How many Bianca's are currently in your district, building the foundation towards their opportunity to engage the world?




The NASB Staff, Board and family is sad to share the passing of Naomi Brummond, a 22-year member of the Bancroft-Rosalie Board of Education.



Federal Update: Impact Aid/Voucher Opposition





This week, the U.S. House of Representatives' Armed Services Committee convened a full committee meeting to markup H.R. 5515, the National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA). NSBA sent a letter to the House Armed Services Committee and House Education and the Workforce Committee to express strong opposition for the inclusion of H.R. 5199 or any school voucher or privatization amendment in the NDAA.

In the letter, NSBA points out that H.R. 5199 undermines the statutory intent of the Impact Aid program, which provides funds to more than 1,100 local education agencies (LEAs) that have lost property tax revenue due to the presence of tax-exempt federal property or that educate federally connected children. H.R. 5199 would redirect more than \$400 million in federal funding designated for our public-school districts through the Impact Aid program to education savings accounts (ESAs) for private school tuition (thereby functioning as a voucher program). If passed into law, this legislation would divert public dollars away from public schools serving military families, circumvent state and local oversight of education service providers, and not ensure accountability for student academic achievement.

The House Armed Services Committee reported H.R. 5515 without any provisions for ESAs or vouchers. In other words, no voucher or privatization provisions were considered in this week's full committee markup or during the Subcommittee on Military Personnel markup earlier this month. However, H.R. 5199 or a similar provision could still be introduced during House floor consideration of the NDAA, or in the U.S. Senate (S. 2517) when the Senate Armed Services Committee considers the defense reauthorization provisions in the coming weeks. NSBA has continued Capitol Hill meetings to oppose this measure during further legislative proceedings for NDAA.

Many thanks to the state school boards associations and local school boards that are advocating against legislation to redirect funding from the Impact Aid program to education savings accounts (ESAs) that would function as a voucher program for military-connected students. Your responses to our legislative alerts are effective in helping protect the Impact Aid program that provides more than \$1 billion each year to our public-school districts that educate populations of federally connected students (including those from military installations whose parents/guardians are enlisted in the Armed Forces, and those from tribal trust lands).

Please continue your outreach to members of Congress, urging them to oppose any voucher or privatization amendments to the defense reauthorization bill.
