NEW BOARD MEETING REQUIREMENT: ARE YOUR AGENDAS & MINUTES COMPLIANT?

Did you know Beginning July 31, 2022, school boards, among others shall make available on such entity's public web site the agenda AND minutes of any meeting of the governing body.

That's right, Nebraska school boards must make sure meeting agendas and minutes are posted, in detail per the passing of LB 83 – "Change public meeting provisions and provide for virtual conferencing under the Open Meetings Act," approved by the Governor on April 21, 2021.

Here are the specifics the board/district must adhere to as stated in the bill:

• "Each public body shall keep minutes of all meetings, showing the time, place, members present and absent, and the substance of all matters discussed. Minutes shall be written and available electronically for inspection within 10 working days or prior to the next convened meeting, whichever occurs earlier. Minutes and agendas must be available on the public website for at least 6 months."

Notes to take on this law.

- Minutes must be placed on the website within 10 working days prior to the next convened meeting.
- It is acceptable to publish "draft" minutes prior to formal approval by the board.

The intent of the legislation is to enhance the public's ability to follow action and decisions carried out during the board meeting.

Like everything you do as a board, the meetings must be conducted in open session, and the board agenda must provide descriptive language to inform patrons of the items to be addressed during the meeting. Compliance with this legislation ensures district patrons have the access to the full scope of decisions by the district.

It is very important for your district to be in compliance with this new law, which may prevent your district from being the topic of discussion on the floor of the legislature, or by other interested parties.

We understand many districts across Nebraska already post the board agendas and minutes on the district website for access by the general public, in a timely fashion, and provide the appropriate detail, but there are districts that will need to comply. This is a heads up to not only make sure your process and procedures are up to date to satisfy the needs of LB 83, but to also let you know where you can get some help or feedback if you think your agendas and minutes not quite be up to the new standards which take effect July 31.


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
Good news! Here are some tips to guarantee your detailed agendas and minutes are published as needed:

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For those of you that know me well, my cup is always half full. Therefore, I believe that in every school district across the state non-incumbent candidates are currently attending board meetings, engaging with board members and the superintendent, and he/she aspires to serve to improve and grow education for the students in the school district.

If this vision of mine is real and he/she/they are attending board meetings, what observations do they take away from the meeting?

How much time is the board devoting during the regular board meeting discussing and addressing the improvement and growth of student learning?

Do the board and administration celebrate success? If so, how is that message relayed to the public?

What do non-incumbents perceive their role to be as a board member?

Boards and superintendents that model this form of effective board governance and purposeful leadership are actively engaged in growing in their respective roles. This does not happen by chance, it does mean taking the time to participate in professional development, NASB workshops, conferences, etc. However, when attendance is a challenge for the board, there is a way to bring board development to the board.

A starting point may be a board retreat.

The purpose could be to review, discuss, and consider the proper role and responsibilities of the board and the working relationship with the superintendent.

Besides a board retreat focused on the board-superintendent working relationship, board self-assessment provides a starting point for purposeful conversations for addressing effective board governance. Through a board self-assessment you enable each board member to self-reflect on their contributions and role among their peers on the board. The self-assessment also allows the board to evaluate the cohesive and collective impact as a board working in lockstep with your superintendent to improve student learning in your school district. The outcome of a board self-assessment enables

the board to isolate areas of growth, set goals, and prioritize action steps to support the goals.

Next step, integrate the review and discussion of the board self-assessment into your regular board meeting agenda.

Each month the board will set aside time to discuss one Standard within the assessment. The brief discussion can be utilized to better inform the public of the board's role and responsibilities, provides authentic data on how well the board measures up to the NASB Board Governance Standards, and most important the opportunity to discuss what the board is actively doing to address the improvement of a Standard when identified as an area of growth. The NASB Board Leadership team will work with the board president/superintendent to provide resources to support the board meeting agenda item.

There is so much more to serving on the board of education than showing up for a monthly board meeting, but unfortunately, from the public's view it may appear that it is this simple. When the message portrayed at the board table is focused on trivial matters, personal agendas, and random topics that fail to address the true purpose of improving and growing instruction and learning, we are sending the message to the public and quite possibly the non-incumbent that change is needed.

Pause and reflect, what message is the board conveying to the public? If there is a need for change, or if the focus and work of the board is in lockstep with administration and board meetings are purposefully focused, take the next step and measure the board's success through a board self-assessment, I promise the results will fill your cup. "You only get out what you put in. Do not expect more until you do more." ~Anonymous

NACOLLEGE AND CAREER READY MATHEMATICS STANDARDS

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Prior to her election to the State Board of Education in November 2020, Patti Gubbels served on the Norfolk Board of Education, and was a member of the NASB Board of Directors, and the NASB Legislation Committee since 2016.

Nebraska State Law requires that content area standards in core subjects (reading, writing, mathematics, science, and social studies) be reviewed and updated by the Nebraska State Board of Education every seven years.

Content area standards are statements that identify what students should know and be able to do by the end of each grade level. The content area standards reviewed and revised this year are the College and Career Ready Mathematics Standards.

To review and revise the standards, the Nebraska Department of Education uses a consistent process that relies on the expertise of Nebraska educators.



The Nebraska Department of Education, in selecting members of the writing team, tries to assure that the standards writers represent all sizes of schools from all parts of Nebraska. Members of the writing team include Nebraska educators from all levels of the educational system. Early childhood educators, K-12 teachers, and postsecondary mathematics experts work collaboratively to write and revise standards.

The standards development process includes opportunities for feedback from individuals who are not part of the writing team. For example, the last week in April, the Nebraska Department of Education released the first draft of the College and Career Ready Mathematics Standards to school superintendents for their review and feedback. This past week, the draft standards NDE released the standards so interested parents, community members, teachers, business leaders, and others can provide feedback about the proposed standards through the Public Input Survey found on the NDE website. Constituent feedback guides editing and revision of standards drafts. Each time the editing team revises a draft, the public is given the opportunity to provide input. Sometimes more than one draft is necessary before NDE develops the final draft.

The State Board of Education receives updates from the Nebraska Department of Education staff throughout the development process. Once a final or approval draft is ready, the State Board of Education reviews and votes on the proposed standards. NDE anticipates that the College and Career Ready Mathematics Standards 2022 approval draft will be ready for board review and approval in the fall of 2022. Upon approval by the Nebraska State Board of Education, school districts have one year to adopt the state-approved content standards or adopt standards deemed as equal to or more rigorous than those approved by the State Board of Education.

The goals of the mathematics standards revision are to have standards that (1) allow a student to succeed in entry-level, credit-bearing postsecondary coursework without the need for remediation, (2) include learning concepts and computations of numbers, geometry, algebra, and data and (3) establish essential mathematical habits of mind such as persevering in problem solving, using representations to organize, record, and communicate mathematical ideas, justifying mathematical ideas using precise mathematical terms, using reasoning to solve problems and analyzing mathematical relationships.

The proposed revisions to the 2015 Mathematics Standards establish grade-level learning expectations and provide school districts with the information they need to make instructional decisions, select learning materials, and develop assessments to measure student understanding and mathematics achievement.

The ability to function effectively in the workplace and to make sound decisions as an individual and a member of society depend on mathematical skills and problem solving. While it is imperative that students learn mathematical facts and computations, it is also imperative that they learn how to use reasoning, identify mathematical relationships, analyze data, and think as they are learning. The proposed College and Career Ready Mathematics Standards 2022 establish expectations that all students will be able to "do" math and to think as they form and solve problems.

- TALK about partnerships; Discuss the issues where school boards and legislators can collaborate on policies that impact your shared communities. There is always common ground.
- CALL your advocacy team; We'll help you sort through the candidates and how to contact them. Keep up, stay informed.



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

... DATA ANALYTICS

We are at that point in the school year where boards sometimes look several years ahead and consider the possibility of consolidation with neighboring districts. ... POLICY

For the upcoming school year, each school must have at least one employee who has met the training requirements to administer or assist with the selfadministration of a seizure rescue medication or medication prescribed to treat seizure disorder symptoms. The training will include instruction in administering seizure medications, recognizing the signs and symptoms of seizures, and responding to their signs and symptoms with appropriate steps. You may have also heard that the Legislature has tasked NDE with creating academic standards for the teaching of financial literacy and the history of the Holocaust and other acts of genocide. It requires a fair amount of time to create new curriculum recommendations, so it is very unlikely these will be ready for the 2022-23 school year.

Natural Gas continues to trend higher, recently hitting a 12-year high for next winter's heating season near \$8 on the New York Mercantile. However, prices for the following winter are nearly \$3 lower, and are even a bit lower for the winter after that.
