## DC WEST ROBOTICS: WORLD ROBOT CONFERENCE CHAMPIONS!

It's not every day you hear about a group of Nebraska students who've earned the opportunity to compete in China, let alone come home champions. The DC West Robotics team, led by 7/8 Math Teacher & Robotics Club Sponsor, Dan Maline, can say they have!

First off, anyone who knows even a little bit about robotics knows that Nebraska has some of the best teams around, with a ton of competitions, and the opportunity to compete on a national, and even world level with anyone. Locally, there are hundreds of VEX robotics teams in Nebraska alone.

Dan himself has been involved with robotics in the Omaha area since 2009, working with various schools and students as he opened the National Robotics Academy. This led to the beginnings of a relationship with DC West, where his children now attend school. At the time, his son was a 4th grader, so Dan gathered a few interested kids together to try a new robotics platform, and the program has grown from there. Some middle school teams were developed, the groups had quick success at various regional events, and became middle school state champions.

From there, it all started to blossom. The kids began to excel, and pick up really good skills. They took runner up at the Heartland Regional (formerly the Nebraska State Championship, but now includes Iowa as well), which opened the door to be invited to China, along with eight other US teams.

Now, being offered the opportunity to go to China is not something you can easily pass up. China prides themselves on being the best, and rarely lets those from outside countries in. The trip itself was paid for by local and national sponsors like 3M, with Dan, the four students who make up the team, and two parents making the trip. (Note: three of the four students attend DC West, the fourth attends Millard South and options into DC West for Robotics).

Once in China, the format matches two robots vs two robots. Then, for the qualifying

matches, the top twenty-four teams (in three team alliances) advance to dual best two out of three in quarterfinals, semifinals, and finals. DC West was actually paired with two teams from Shanghai during this portion of the tournament.

As Dan explained, once there, in competition, everything seemed to just go DC West's way. It was an up and down tournament for a lot of teams, including DC West, but when the elimination matches came about, they were incredibly successful. In the end, DC West was the World Robot Conference champions, and beat the reigning world champions in the finals!

School Board President, Kelly Hinrichs stated "The passion that Dan has for what he does and the drive he has to help build this program has been phenomenal ... from simply starting the program, to now world robot conference champions! It is a testament to our small town school that we can go up against anyone in the world and compete."



Dan noted too, that in robotics, you work on somewhat of an annual schedule. In the US, teams get a new game, or assignment each April and have plenty of time to brainstorm, design, build, test, and apply their ideas before taking their finished robots to competitions. The schedule for China was a lot tighter, giving the team a much smaller window of time to go from start to finish. This meant some 8-10 hour evenings for the team knowing they'd be facing the world's best, who would already be in midseason form.

All in all, Dan explained that the entire process was a phenomenal experience for the kids, and made the team, and program so much better, even putting them ahead of schedule for this year's local events. If invited, they would jump at the opportunity to do this again.

Kelly closed proudly stating, "This is one of DC West's biggest accomplishment's, period! And we know this is just the start of what they will continue to accomplish."

# Pioneer Academy Builds Upon Successful First Year

After a successful first year, the Pioneer Academy is ready to offer eligible juniors and seniors credits for both high school graduation and junior college courses, as well as providing useful job skills in health services, welding, construction and information technology.

Health and welding classes are currently taught at Nebraska City High School, while the Pioneer Academy houses the information technology and construction classes. Superintendent Jeff Edwards said last year's success of the construction component of the Pioneer Academy led Southeast Community College to offer the courses and job skills at other locations around southeast Nebraska.



"We've had lots of requests for services and projects from the construction students," said Edwards, including a custom-built front door for a home in Percival, Iowa; plaques for last year's Nebraska City Middle School year-end awards assembly; and a table at the MRB-Lewis and Clark Center. In another part of the academy, information technology students solved a problem that saved the district about \$25 in equipment replacement. The IT students were able to use the academy's 3-D printer to replicate a plastic brace on a piece of construction equipment, he said, rather than having to purchase a replacement part.

Pioneer Academy students complete an application process to enter the academy and they complete portfolios, write resumes and create personal websites during their time in the academy. Students in the SCC service area can explore 10 different career pathways if they qualify to participate in the Southeast Nebraska Career Academy Partnership.

Areas of study not currently offered in Nebraska City include agriculture, business, criminal justice, and early and secondary childhood education, said Edwards, who added that additional areas of study will be added to the Pioneer Academy in the future. Through an arrangement with SCC and the generosity of the Steinhart and Nelson Foundations, students do not have to pay anything to take classes at the Pioneer Academy.

Students who successfully complete two years of courses at the Pioneer Academy are also eligible to bypass SCC wait lists, said Edwards. After the needs of the Nebraska City High School students are met, said Edwards, students from other Otoe County high schools, as well as home-schooled students, can apply for remaining openings at the Pioneer Academy.

"The Pioneer Academy is a great opportunity for all students in our district. The skills learned will allow students to go straight to the workforce or college with the knowledge of what their field of interest will be like. We truly thank the Steinhart and Nelson Foundations for the financial support given to all students in the program. As the parent of a 1st year Academy student I see the excitement of learning new skills, and hearing the importance of completing the college homework. Being able to work hands on in the Welding Shop is a great learning opportunity that my son will carry with him into his Agriculture field of interest when he enters college. We thank the staff, board, and community for supporting this new learning opportunity for all students in Nebraska City."

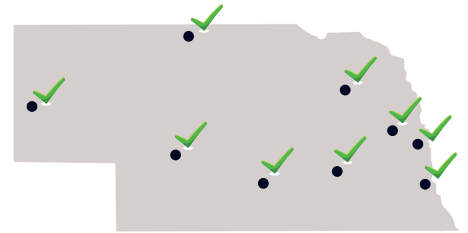

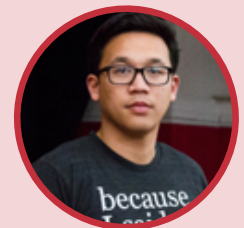

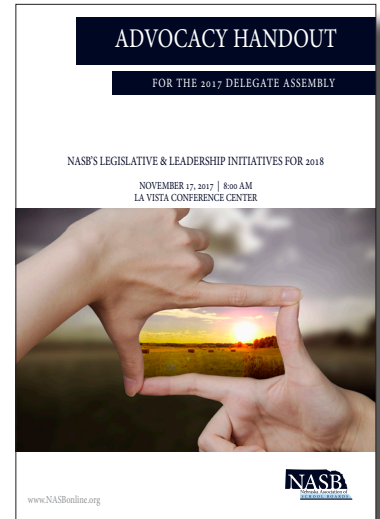
