Don't take for granted the access we have as Nebraskans to our State Senators & Federal Representatives.

It is not like that everywhere!

The 2018 Legislative Session kicks off January 3!

Stay informed, involved, and engaged with NASB's legislative communication and these tips to be a better advocate for your district, community, and all of Nebraska!



Last year, there were:

- 667 Bills Introduced, 130 Bills related to Education and/or Taxes
- 114 Bills that remain on General/Select File
- 173 Bills that became Law
- 30 Bills held by the Education Committee

Your role as an advocate for education and *EDUCATING* is more important than ever!



With term limits and the like, in the past 10 years, there have been more than 100 new Senators elected. In 2018:

- 24 of 49 seats are up for election.
- 16 seated Senators face re-election.
- At least 8 new Senators will be elected.
 (6 Senators are term-limited, 2 not re-running)
- 74% of the current body has less than 4-years experience.
 (36 of 49 are new as of 2014)

You are likely educating them on the good or bad of the particular bill.
